- Establish clear business accountability and standards-enabled governance for critical data assets, moving from reactive data-quality fixes towards proactive management of trusted information.
- Connect product, location, organization and event data using standards such as GTINs and GLNs to strengthen interoperability, supply-chain visibility, traceability and regulatory readiness.
- Build sufficiently consistent and trusted data across suppliers, distributors, hospitals and care environments to support operational intelligence today and scale automation and AI tomorrow.

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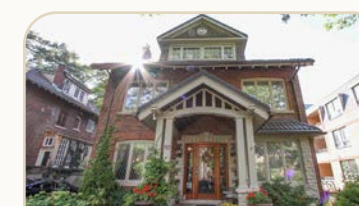

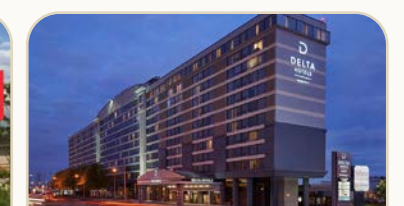
